



# Frequently Asked Questions

## **Where and when is this event?**

Gallatin City Cemetery  
Saturday, Oct. 7

Tours start between 5 and 9 p.m.

## **How much is this event?**

Tickets range from \$12-18 presale;  
\$20 day of (if available).  
Kids 12 and under are free.

## **How long are the tours?**

Each tour will last approximately 1 hour to 1  
hour and 15 minutes

## **Where should I park?**

Some of the streets around the Gallatin City  
Cemetery will be closed for pedestrian  
safety. You can find street parking, park in  
the local church parking lots, or near City  
Hall (0.4 mile).

## **How early should I arrive?**

As each tour is timed, we suggest arriving  
no later than 10 minutes before so you can  
check in and find your tour group.

## **Where do I check in?**

The back of the line to enter will be from  
W Smith Street on Cemetery Ave.  
There will be a tent for people to check in  
(or purchase day-of tickets if available).  
You will then be grouped in your respective  
tour time.

## **Do I need my paper ticket to check in?**

Not necessarily. The tickets will be  
under the purchaser's name. If you  
know your purchaser's name, you can  
let the check in team know that's the  
group you're with.

## **What should I wear?**

It's looking to be a chilly evening. Please  
dress warm. You will be walking in  
some grassy areas as well as on  
concrete; proper foot attire is  
recommended.

## **Is this wheelchair accessible?**

Yes, but we suggest you book your tour  
time while there is still daylight (the sun  
will set around 6:30 p.m., so we suggest  
a tour time that starts before 5:30 p.m.).

## **Can I bring my dog?**

Unfortunately, animals are not allowed  
on this tour.

## **Do I need to bring money for anything?**

There will be concessions for sale as a  
fundraiser for the Sumner County  
Museum. Additionally, there will be a  
merch tent with history-related items.  
Cash or card is accepted. Venmo, Cash  
App and PayPal are preferred.

## **Is this a scary tour?**

While the event does take place in the  
evening in a cemetery, no, this tour is not  
scary. The content is appropriate for  
all ages.
